2024 Application Process

1. A completed RIFA application and Money Order, Dept. Check or P.O. Number must be received by **May 19, 2024**.
2. Applications will NOT BE ACCEPTED without payment or dept. PO#. **Generous donations by the RIAFC Foundation & RISFFL** will be applied to pay most of the fee for R.I. students. All out of state students will need to pay the whole fee.

You will be notified by email from the RIFA of which class selection you received on or before May 23, 2024, **THEN** (not before please) you will submit the on-line NFA application. **The ‘endorser’ will be the Academy’s Secretary/Clerk (Breanna.Palazzo@dbr.ri.gov), not your Chief please!** NFA Applications must be filled out **COMPLETELY** online. Students must obtain a FEMA Student Identification Number (SID) first.
6. Failure to submit the NFA online application will cause a room not being reserved for you by the NFA.

Prerequisite for on-campus classes

All students **must complete** Incident Command System ICS-100 and ICS-200 levels (on-line training) **before arriving** for on-campus class. If you have completed them ON-LINE previously, you don't have to do it again.



Two-Day Course Descriptions

W0322 Incident Command System for Structural Collapse Incidents

Fire officers gain an understanding of command operations at structural collapse incidents including response operations, basic command procedures and Incident Command System (ICS) organizational structure.

W0458 Preparation for Initial Company Operations

Better understanding of the role and responsibilities of Company Officers (COs) in preparing their company for incident operations and to clarify the transition from firefighter to CO and the new roles relating to leadership and safety. This course is designed for COs, acting COs or senior firefighters responsible for the management of a single fire company at an emergency incident, including those officers who are responsible for company readiness, personnel safety and leadership as it relates to company operation.

W0520 Executive Skills Series: Exercising Leadership Within Communities

Gain an understanding of a variety of ideas, peoples and cultures and the skills for effective leadership when confronting adaptive challenges presented by diverse internal and external communities.

W0521 Executive Skills Series: Exercising Leadership to Facilitate Adaptive Change

Develop an understanding of skills associated with exercising leadership to resolve adaptive problems (those problems where the solution is either unknown or requires significant change, or both).

W0610 Wildland Urban Interface Firefighting for the Structural Company Officer

The objective of this 2-day course is to provide fire service authority figures understanding about operational activities and safety concerns for structural Company Officers assigned to a wildland urban interface (WUI) incident, including command and control issues of WUI firefighting.

W0648 Leadership in Supervision: Frameworks to Success

Supervisors learn leadership skills and tools needed to perform effectively, including professionalism, resilience, emotional intelligence, and situational awareness.

W0729 Incident Safety Officer

Learn the details of the safety officer's role and responsibilities at emergency responses to all-hazards types of situations, with focus on operations within an Incident Command System (ICS).

W0761 New Fire Chief: Administrative Issues

The primary audience is newly appointed fire chiefs in volunteer, combination, or career departments, as well as emergency medical services (EMS) chiefs. The secondary audience is department leaders and current officers who may become fire chiefs, as well as local government administrators and elected officials who are involved in the administration of a fire department or EMS.

W0770 Fire Investigation: First Responders

Review the basics of fire chemistry and develop an understanding of the role of the first responder in relation to fire suppression & investigation, including evidence identification & preservation.

Travel Arrangements

You must make your own travel arrangements for the trip. Driving time is typically 8 hours from Rhode Island. Air travel can be arranged to either Reagan National Airport or Baltimore-Washington International Airport. You will be responsible for providing your own transportation to NFA if you wish to fly.

Transportation costs are the responsibility of the student or his/her organization and will not be reimbursed by the National Fire Academy or the Rhode Island Fire Instructors Association. Be sure to arrive at the NFA by 3 p.m. on Friday to check into the dormitory and attend the 7 p.m. orientation session.

NFA No-Show Policy

It is the policy of the National Fire Academy that persons who fail to show up for class and have not canceled their enrollment will be suspended from attending NFA courses for a period of two years.
